Eve Krahe Billings, Ph.D., EDAC is the inaugural Dean of Research and Innovation at the University of Phoenix. Prior to this position, she served as Associate Dean in the College of Doctoral Studies and before that, oversaw the University's graduate programs and graduate faculty in the College of Health Professions, successfully securing accreditation from the Commission on the Accreditation for Healthcare Management Education (CAHME) for the College's Master of Healthcare Administration. The UOPX MHA is the largest academic program and one of the first asynchronous programs in the history of CAHME to receive accreditation. Before joining University of Phoenix, Eve was Director of Undergraduate and Graduate Healthcare Innovation Programs at Arizona State University (ASU) and held the rank of Associate Professor.

Krahe is a member of the Board of Directors of the American Association of University Administrators and chairs the Professional Development Committee. She is a past member of the Board of Directors of the Arizona Humanities Council and executive committee, and now leads the organization's Advisory Board. She is a founding member of the Upsilon Phi Delta Health Administration Honors Society chapter at the University of Phoenix, and a founding member of the ASU Center for Interprofessional Education and Research. She has participated as an invited judge at the ASU Herberger Design School's Health and Healing Environments Design Charrette. She is a member of the Society for Ethics Across the Curriculum (SEAC) and sits on doctoral committees at the University of Phoenix, ASU, and elsewhere. She is a reviewer for several academic journals. She is a 2020 HERS Fellowship Alumna. Her most recent research focuses on the cultivation of empathy through engagement in the medical humanities and Storytelling.
